

Rathlin Island

Rathlin Island is an iconic landmark off the northern coastline of County Antrim and forms part of the panorama of the Causeway Coastal Route. It lies just six miles off the coast from Ballycastle. The high sea cliffs lend an aura of mystery, urging you to explore what lies beyond, but arguably, its greatest asset is the breeding seabird colony. The island also boasts significant natural heritage sites and is internationally important for its flora and, in some cases, its unique marine life. Visitors' cars are restricted, and the roads are quiet and ideal for walking and cycling. On the island you can follow the Sustrans National Cycle Network Route to the West Lighthouse, East Lighthouse and Rue Lighthouse or follow any of seven walking trails.

To reach the island, take the ferry from Ballycastle Harbour to Church Bay, Rathlin. There are two ferries and the journey will take no longer than 40 minutes. You can choose to do a round trip in a day or stay a while and enjoy unique accommodation and hospitality. The island's strong cultural heritage, with storytelling, songs and music, is legendary.

Discover orchids and the rare pyramidal bugle, as well as breeding seabirds and waders as you enjoy the walking trails and interpretive panels. BT54 6RT.

Venture south on the island for amazing views of the coastline, as well as wildlife, such as seals. Irish hare and curlew. BT54 6SB.

Knockan's Viewpoint

Feast your eyes on panoramic views of Church Bay, Rue Point, the Causeway Coast and the Mull of Kintyre. BT54 6SB.

RSPB Rathlin West Light Seabird Centre

Head to the Seabird Centre from late April to early July for close-up views of the puffins and other seabirds as they gather in their thousands to rear their chicks. Check out the unique 'upside-down' lighthouse that watches over the choppy seas. Access is via ferry from Ballycastle. BT54 6RT.

The Glens of Antrim

Endowed with evocative names and blessed with a diversity of landscape, The Glens are rich in history, folklore and natural beauty, each is named according to its attributes. Escape to a world away from the frantic bustle of modern life and explore the woods, waterfalls, riverside paths, viewing points and forest parks among Glencloy (the glen of the hedges), Glenarm (the glen of the army), Glenariff (the fertile glen), Glenballyeamon (the Edwardstown glen), Glencorp (the glen of the slaughtered), Glenann (the glen of the colt's foot), Glendun (the glen of the brown river), Glenshesk (the sedgy glen) and Glentaisie (the glen of Taisie of the bright sides). This section brings you along the coast from Waterfoot, through Cushendall and Cushendun, to Ballycastle and Rathlin Island, before sweeping inland to Armoy. There is no doubt this area contains some of the most striking and varied scenery in Northern Ireland.

Places of Interest

Waterfoot Beach

Backed by sand dunes, it is a conservation area known for the presence of the yellow rattle flower and the small copper butterfly. BT44 0JE.

Murlough Bay

Buzzards and peregrine falcons hunt along the cliff tops at Murlough Bay, while eider and fulmar skirt along the bottom. There are car parks on different levels and picnic areas from which to enjoy the breath-taking views. BT54 6RG.

Torr Head


A remote headland with jaw-dropping vistas stretching over the North Channel as far as Scotland (on a clear day). BT54 6RQ.

Loughareema Lake

A natural phenomenon—a sparkling oasis one day and just a few days later, a bed of cracked mud with not a drop of water in sight. BT44 0TA.

Q Fair Head

This is a ruggedly beautiful and remote area for climbers and walkers. As Northern Ireland's tallest cliff face, Fair Head is believed to be the biggest expanse of climbable rock in either Ireland or Britain. A series of walks begin at the farm car park (nominal charges apply) which is clearly signposted off the Fairhead Road. Anglers should also note that the Fair Head lakes are stocked with trout and can be fished during the summer months. BT54 6RD.

cushendall

Known locally as 'The Capital of the Glens', Cushendall is a beautiful conservation town at the foot of Lurigethan Mountain.

Places of Interest

The Curfew Tower

A prominent feature of the town built in 1817 by Francis Turnly, BT44 0RP.

Red Bay Castle

The ruins of the castle, reputedly built by Sir James MacDonnell lie on the outskirts of the town and date back to around 1561. BT44 OSH.

Layde Old Church

The chief burial place of the MacDonnell Clan (after Bonamargy Friary, see page 16). BT44 0NH.

Cottage Wood

Surround yourself in the peaceful setting of the 10-acre Cottage Wood, where you can enjoy a series of interesting walks, viewpoints, picnic facilities and playparks with occasional glimpses of red squirrels. BT44 ORR.

The Cliff Path

This attractive coastal path hugs the cliffs to the north of Cushendall and offers spectacular views of the Scottish coast, Lurigethan, Red Bay Castle and the Garron Plateau. BT44 ONG.

Glenariff Forest Park

1,000 hectares of planted woodland, lakes, outdoor recreation spaces and conservation areas where you can enjoy walking, horse riding and touring. Make the most of your visit by staying overnight in a touring vehicle. There are several walking trails through the forest which give spectacular views and glimpses of wildlife, including the 3km Waterfall Walk Trail. Experience afternoon tea at the Glenariff Teahouse. Q Glendun Viaduct

An impressive structure built in 1839 by the world-renowned English architect Sir Charles Lanyon. BT44 0SU.

Cregagh Wood

An ancient woodland site and local nature reserve, abundant with specialist flora and home to a population of red squirrels. BT44 0QD.

Ballycastle (in 2022 crowned the Best Place to live in Northern Ireland by The Sunday Times) is a small seaside town, where tradition and culture run parallel with modern living. The popular beach runs from the pier at Ballycastle Marina at the western end to the stunning Pans Rocks in the east.

The accredited Ballycastle Museum is housed in the town's 18th century courthouse and market building. Visitors can explore the fascinating history of the Irish Home Industries Workshop and the important role it played in the Arts and Crafts Revival in Ulster. Highlights on display include the Liscolman pot (an early Bronze Age food vessel), glass and a tram axle associated with Boyd's 18th century industries and the magnificent Taise Banner from the first Feis na nGleann in 1904.

Ballycastle Forest

Ballycastle Forest, on the slopes of Knocklayd Mountain, was first planted in 1931. Most of this early woodland has now been clearfelled and replanted, producing a more diverse range of wildlife habitats and offering panoramic views of the coast to the north and Rathlin Island, and on a clear day the Scottish Islands of Islay and Jura are visible. Q Bonamargy Friary

Built by Rory McQuillan, the friary was claimed by the MacDonnell Clan in the 16th century. It contains a sealed burial vault, wherein lie the coffins of several Earls of Ulster and chieftain, Sorley Boy MacDonnell. BT54 6QP

The Causeway Coast

The next section of the Causeway Coastal Route takes you from Ballintoy to Coleraine and inland to Kilrea and Garvagh. It too promises extraordinary beauty with spectacular coastal scenery, dramatic cliffs and headlands, and natural rural landscapes as far as the eye can see. We recommend you take your time, enjoy the journey, and immerse yourself in some of the unique experiences along the way.

Places of Interest

Portaneevey Viewpoint

Located on the B15 near Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge, Portaneevey viewpoint has a car park, picnic areas, coastal walk, landscaping and cliff-edge viewing platforms. If you can't cross the bridge, treat yourself to panoramic views of the Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge, Rathlin and further afield to the Mull of Kintyre in Scotland. BT54 6LR.

Kinbane Castle

Kinbane Castle is a little-known, secluded ruin located at the bottom of a sheer cliff face. It is a hidden gem, guaranteeing the visitor an air of peace and solitude which is often not easy to find. BT54 6LP.

Q Whitepark Bay

A delightful sandy, half-moon-shaped beach situated between two headlands. Backed by sand dunes and cliffs, even the local cows like to hang out at the beach. Bathing is not recommended due to strong currents. BT44 6NH.

Portbradden Harbour

The 'chocolate box', picturesque Portbradden Harbour is nestled beneath the cliff at the end of Whitepark Bay. There is limited parking and access to the coastal path. BT57 8TA.

Dunseverick Castle

All that remains of the castle is a small wall on a high crag that faces the ocean. Nearby is the dramatic Dunseverick waterfall that flows directly into the sea. BT57 6LP.

Magheracross Viewpoint

Two spectacular viewing platforms, extending out to the edge of the headland provide the perfect pitstop on the Causeway Coast, whether cycling, driving or on foot. Take a break to appreciate the stunning views of Whiterocks beach and Dunluce Castle and enjoy an ice cream or a coffee from the distinctive blue Cream on the Coast van located at the onsite car park. Coach parking also available. BT57 8UY.

Q Ballypatrick Forest (Grid reference: D181359)

Located on the main A2 road near the intriguing Loughareema and the Glens of Antrim, the forest includes off-road car parking, picnic areas and a waymarked walking trail. Watch out for occasional glimpses of the elusive red squirrel and sika deer. 'Touring in the Trees' caravan site is next to the car park.



Ballintoy

Approaching Ballintoy from the east, the road steeply descends Knocksoghey Hill, passing by the entrance to Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge and Larrybane. Ballintoy village offers a small shop, tourist accommodation and restaurants. A sideroad leads past the quaint white Ballintoy Church planted on the flat cliff top, on its way down to the harbour. Ballintoy Harbour was the Game of Thrones® filming location for Lordsport, the main port of Pyke and the Iron Islands. Ballintoy and its harbour are an ideal stopping place while touring the coastal route.

National Trust - Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge

Crossing the bridge 30 metres above sea level is an exhilarating experience, high above the water and open to the elements. Thousands of people come every year to see beautiful coastal scenery and spot rare wildlife. The bridge is located 1km from the carpark and the path includes a steep hill and steps. Pre-book online.

National Trust - Giant's Causeway Visitor Experience

Northern Ireland's first UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Giant's Causeway is home to a wealth of local history and legend. The 40,000 basalt columns left by volcanic eruptions 60 million years ago, have captured the imagination of all who see it. Portballintrae

Portballintrae is a seaside village close to Bushmills with a small sandy beach and pretty harbour area. There is a car park, picnic area, toilets and shop adjacent to the beach. The small harbour is a focal point for many water activities in the village. Runkerry Beach is also a wonderful place to explore but is not suitable for bathing or water sports due to rip currents. The village has close associations with La Girona, one of 24 ships from the 1588 Spanish Armada which were wrecked along the Irish coast. Its treasure, recovered by divers during the 1960s and brought ashore at Portballintrae, can be viewed today in Belfast's Ulster Museum. The village also acts as a trailhead for many wonderful coastal walking opportunities, including the section of the Causeway Coast Way providing off-road walking to the Giant's Causeway, approximately 1.5 miles away.







Dungiven

The market town of Dungiven (meaning Given's Fort) lies nine miles south of Limavady, near the foot of Benbradagh Mountain. The surrounding areas contain many places of historical significance including Dungiven Castle. The first castle was built by the O'Cahan clan but the existing structure was constructed by Robert Ogilby in the 1800s. It now operates as a Gael Scoil and is not open to the public.

Places of Interest

Q Dungiven Priory and O'Cahan's Tomb

The ancient Augustinian Priory was founded by the O'Cahan Clan in AD1100 and occupies a picturesque site 200ft above the River Roe. BT47 4PF.

Banagher Old Church

This impressive ruin is a religious site dating from the late 11th or early 12th century. Legend has it that sand gathered from a nearby tomb brings the beneficiary good luck. BT47 4SR.

Bovevagh Old Church

Commonly interpreted as deriving from Maeve's Church, this church has been in ruins since 1622. BT47 4NP.

The Auglish Stone Circles

This dramatic headland, sheltered by Sheep Island, is beside the exhilarating Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge. Used in Season 2 Episode 3 as Renly Baratheon's camp, and where Brienne was named to Renly's Kingsguard. In Season 6 Episode 5 it was the setting for the Kingsmoot. BT54 6LS

Downhill Beach ~ Dragonstone

An 11km stretch of sand and surf, this stunning beach is home to Mussenden, a tiny temple perched dramatically on a 120ft cliff top. In Season 2 Episode 1 this is where Melisandre burnt the effigies of the Seven Gods of Westeros. BTS1 4RH

Portstewart Strand ~ Coast of Dorne

Here Jamie and Bronn came ashore only to be discovered by Dornish soldiers. It's also where Ellaria and the Sand Snakes vow vengeance against the Lannisters in Season 5 Episode 4. BT55 7LX

Cycling

Cyclists are spoilt for choice for great cycling routes in Causeway Coast and Glens. With a choice of inland and coastal ways suitable for all levels of ability, you can enjoy a memorable experience on two wheels.

Eagle's Glen Cycle Route (14 miles)

A hilly trail on the picturesque Glenullin Valley, exploring the Errigal landscape and Garvagh forest.

The Lower Bann Cycleway (45 miles)

Cycle between Toome and Castlerock following the Lower Bann River corridor from Lough Neagh to where the river enters the Atlantic Ocean at The Barmouth near Castlerock.

Bann Valley Cycle Route (15 miles)

Linking Garvagh and Kilrea on quiet country roads, this route traverses the fertile landscape of the Bann Valley, with views beyond towards the Antrim Hills.

The Banagher Cycle Route (28 miles)

A challenging trail, circling the foothills of the Sperrin Mountains and passing through uplands, farmlands, towns and villages.

NCN Route 93 from Ballyshannon to Ballycastle (236 miles)

Superb coastal scenery and some traffic free cycle paths. Experienced cyclists may choose to venture off the signed routes and explore the countryside. Marked by distinctive signage.

Walking

Walking in the Causeway Coast and Glens offers endless possibilities. Taking in the incredible scenery on foot can be as challenging or relaxing as you choose. From strolling along our many miles of golden, sandy beaches, to following marked trails through forests, past waterfalls, to mountain tops and through valleys, there is a walk to suit everyone.

The Moyle Way (27 miles/42km)

The Moyle Way, connecting the coastal settlements of Ballycastle and Waterfoot, runs through the heart of the Glens of Antrim, taking the walker through an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and a land of geology, wildlife, history and folklore. Following a mixture of forest tracks and remote upland moor, the 42km route traverses the slopes of Trostan, Antrim's highest summit at 550m. The mountain sections can be wet and rough underfoot. Full navigation skills are required in bad weather.

The Causeway Coast Way (33 miles/52km)

The Causeway Coast Way takes walkers along Northern Ireland's most celebrated coastline, connecting the coastal resorts of Portstewart and Ballycastle. The 52km route includes sandy beaches, dramatic cliff paths, iconic viewpoints and world famous historic and natural landmarks. With frequent access points, including car parking and facilities, and terrain suitable for all fit walkers, this route provides walking opportunities for a wide range of users.

The North Sperrins Way (37 miles/60km)

Connecting Dungiven and Castlerock this route provides an upland trail experience across open mountain and forest. It traverses higher ground forming the northern foothills of the Sperrin Mountains, passing notable landscape features including Benbradagh and Binevenagh, with spectacular views over Lough Foyle towards Donegal.

For the ultimate challenge, walkers can follow the 284 miles / 457km International Appalachian Trail Ulster Ireland that traverses Causeway Coast and Glens.
